TAKE SURVEY

WHAT'S IN A

Create name art! Choose a fun way to be artistic with your name from this Pinterest board or come up with an idea on your own!

Talk together about the meaning behind each family member's name and why they were given it.

WHAT IS YOUR STORY?

Start a journal in a binder. Put your name art in it as your first page! It can be a picture journal, a combo of pictures/writing, or just writing. Use clear sheet covers so you can slide in your artwork. Include lined pages for writing and blank pages for art.

Make a goal to journal regularly for the next 20 days about the fun things you are learning!

3 ALL ABOUT ME

Visit the Family Search All About Me page to discover fun facts and quizzes about the year you were born and your name. Choose some favorite facts and write them in your journal. Did anything surprise you?

GROW YOUR FAMILY TREE

Let's take a look at the branches of your family tree. Create a four generation family tree starting with your child. You can print pictures, draw pictures, or just do names.

5 READ WITH

Did your ancestors leave stories behind? Visit the memories section of Family Search to see! Go to your tree in <u>Family Search</u>. Change the view to fan chart and click on stories. It will show you all your ancestors who have stories! Choose a few each day to read. Be on the lookout for meaningful quotes to use tomorrow.

6 QUOTE ME

Have you come across any quotes from your ancestors? Print out the quote and hang it where you can regularly read it together. Memorize their words!

Want to do more? Copy down the quote to practice your handwriting! If you weren't able to find a quote, print a famous one that inspires you that you would like to learn.



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7 RECREATE A

Find a photo of an ancestor's home and recreate it! Don't have a photo? Recreate your own home! Use Legos, Minecraft, whatever your favorite building materials are.

TAKE A
VIRTUAL
FIELD TRIP

Until you are able to walk where your ancestors walked, virtual field trips are the next best thing! There are hundreds of virtual field trips all over the world - historical sites, museums, national parks.

Choose a topic/location that relates to your family history and enjoy a field trip together. Be sure to write about it in your journal! Find fun field trips <a href="https://example.com/here/here/">here</a>!

9 LEARN ABOUT THE CENSUS
